

Face masks with antiseptic wood wool

What may sound strange to some used to be standard: Due to its antiseptic properties, wood wool had a firm place in hygiene, especially in surgical wound care. So why not make face masks with wood wool filling?

Lindner Suisse in Wattwil SG has been producing wood wool for 100 years. They now want to use their experience and knowledge of the properties of wood wool for hygiene. If bandages made of wood wool were used in the past, why should wood wool not also be used for face masks? The special wood wool has an antiseptic effect and has the ability to absorb moisture, for example from aerosols.

The Lindner "Face masks with the plus" are filled with the natural wood wool material. Carefully selected FSC®- and PEFC-certified Swiss wood (HSH) is used as the raw material. The wood wool is produced according to the Swiss wood wool standard; it meets the highest quality requirements.

Lindner Suisse is the only wood wool manufacturer in Switzerland today. It produces wood wool for more than 180 applications, such as in agriculture for udder hygiene, as well as for the storage, transport, and presentation of unpackaged food (e.g. fruits, vegetables, and dried meat).
